(SCFS) is conducting a Community Needs Assessment Survey to identify the basic living needs to ensure that every family has a chance at achieving a better quality of life in *Robeson, Scotland, Bladen, Brunswick, Columbus, Hoke,* and *Pender* counties. The assessment survey is a part of SCFS' *Community Services Block Grant (CSBG),* which the agency receives from the N.C. Department of Health and Human Services to fund their *Family Empowerment Self-Sufficiency Project (FESS).*FESS' mission is to work with families to determine their individual and family strengths, needs, and visions for the future, and to help them achieve them. "We are improving and expanding our CSBG FESS program to better serve the needs of families in a holistic approach.
